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Pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-431.02, notice is hereby given to the members of the general public, the parties and the Arizona Power Plant and Transmission Line Siting Committee (“Committee”), that the Committee will hold a public meeting/hearing on the above application that is open to the public at the High Country Conference Center, located at 201 West Butler Avenue, Flagstaff, Arizona 86001, commencing on Tuesday, October 11, 2022, at 1:00 p.m., and will continue each weekday on Wednesday, October 12 through Thursday, October 13, 2022, as necessary, at the same location beginning at 9:00 a.m. on each day. No tour of the Project area is planned by the Chairman at this time. If the Chairman or Committee later decide to conduct a tour, notice that includes a map and itinerary of any such tour will be available at the hearing and posted on the Project website at <https://www.aes.com/west-camp-wind> and the ACC website at: <https://www.azcc.gov/arizona-power-plant/meeting-schedule>.

Public comment will be taken in a special evening session on Tuesday, October 11, 2022, at 5:30 p.m. and may be taken at the beginning of each hearing day or at other times during the hearing at times designated by the Chairman. 5 comment, and the time needed for deliberations by the Committee. As a part of the public
6 meeting/hearing, members of the Committee will discuss the potential value of a tour, and,
7 at the discretion of the Chairman, may tour the location of the proposed project area as set
8 forth above.

23 reporter at the designated stops. The Chairman will make any procedural
24 decisions concerning stops at different points of interest;


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9. Vote and decision concerning findings of fact, conclusions of law, the certificate of environmental compatibility and conditions to the certificate of environmental compatibility;
