**FIRST AMENDED AGENDA**

Pinal Avenue, Casa Grande, Arizona 85122, commencing on Tuesday, April 18, 2017 at 2:00 p.m., and will continue each weekday on Wednesday, April 19, 2017 through Tuesday, April 25, 2017, as necessary, at the same location beginning at 9:00 a.m. on each day, unless a tour is taken. If a tour is taken, it will begin on Wednesday, April 19, 2017, at approximately 9:00 a.m. or an alternative date and time set by the Chairman of the Committee ("Chairman"). Public comment will be taken in a special evening session on April 18, 2017 at 6:00 p.m. and may be taken at the beginning of each

1 hearing day or at other times during the hearing at times designated by the Chairman.  
2 Unless later ordered by the Chairman, the hearing will adjourn at approximately 5:00  
3 p.m. each day.

4 Additional days for the hearing may be set, and the hearing may conclude  
5 earlier or later than anticipated, depending upon the number of parties that intervene,  
6 the amount of testimony presented, the amount of public comment, and the time  
7 needed for deliberations by the Committee. As a part of the public meeting/hearing,  
8 members of the Committee will discuss the potential value of a tour, and, at the  
9 discretion of the Chairman, may tour the location of the proposed power plants and  
10 transmission lines for the project as set forth above.

11 At the public meeting/hearing, the Committee may consider, discuss, deliberate  
12 and/or vote on the matters on the agenda. Items on the agenda may be taken in a  
13 different order than listed as conditions require:


- 14 1. Call to order;
- 15 2. Roll call;
- 16 3. Consideration of and vote upon any requests to intervene;
- 17 4. Hearing on the application;
- 18 5. Public comment at the discretion of the Chairman;
- 19 6. Discussion of potential value of a tour of the proposed route;
- 20 7. If it is decided a tour would be valuable, the Committee will meet at the  
21 hearing site. The members of the Committee will tour the project. Members  
22 of the public may follow the Committee's tour. No testimony or discussion  
23 with or between Committee members about the application or matters  
24 relating to the application will take place, except on the record before a court  
reporter at the designated stops. The Chairman will make any procedural  
decisions concerning stops at different points of interest;
- 25 8. Discussion of proposed findings of fact, conclusions of law, the certificate of  
26 environmental compatibility and conditions to the certificate of environmental  
compatibility;
- 27 9. Vote and decision concerning findings of fact, conclusions of law, the  
28 certificate of environmental compatibility and conditions to the certificate of  
environmental compatibility; and

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10. Adjournment.
