

# Attendance and Public Comment At the Arizona Corporation Commission

## Frequently Asked Questions

**Q. I want to voice my position on a pending issue at the Arizona Corporation Commission. How can I do that?**

A. There are several ways to voice your position.

1. Electronically submit your comments. Click on the “*Submit a Public Comment for a Utility*” button located on the right of our website ([www.azcc.gov](http://www.azcc.gov)). Fill out the form and type your comments and click to submit.
2. Write a letter to the Commissioners or send an email. The Commission street address as well as the email addresses for each Commissioner are found at [www.azcc.gov](http://www.azcc.gov). Click on “*Contact Us*”.
3. Attend a public comment session or Open Meeting for the item you are interested in and sign up to speak.
4. A person wishing to submit writings that exceed a two page letter must comply with the Corporation Commission’s filing requirements.
5. Call Consumer Services to file a public comment at (602) 542-4251 or 1-800-222-7000.

**Q. I want to speak at an Open Meeting on an item that is on the agenda. How can I do that?**

A. Persons wishing to speak at an Open Meeting can sign up to speak either online or in person. Click on the “*Request to Speak on an Open Meeting Agenda*” link located on the right of our website ([www.azcc.gov](http://www.azcc.gov)) to sign up online, or use one of two electronic kiosks located near the South entrance to the Commission building. The Chairman will call persons to the podium during the appropriate agenda item. Public comment is limited to three (3) minutes per speaker.

**Q. I do not wish to speak at the Open Meeting, but I want to attend. How can I do that?**

A. The Commission holds Open Meetings in Hearing Room 1 which can accommodate general public seating for approximately 100 persons. If necessary, overflow seating is available in Hearing Room 2.

**Q. I want to watch the Open Meeting but do not wish to attend in person. How can I do that?**

A. Any person can watch live proceedings by going to [www.azcc.gov](http://www.azcc.gov) and click on the blue bar “*Live Meeting Broadcast*” on the right side of the website. Persons can also view archived proceedings.
