**PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION  
AND ORDER BARRING DEFENDANTS  
FROM TRANSFERRING ASSETS**

(Assigned to Hon. Rebecca A. Albrecht)

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17 Plaintiff, the Arizona Corporation Commission ("ACC"), having filed a Verified  
18 Complaint, an Application for Preliminary Injunction and Order Barring Defendants from  
19 Transferring Assets, an Application for Temporary Restraining Order Without Notice and for  
20 Petition for Order to Show Cause Regarding Application for Preliminary Injunction and Order  
21 Barring Defendants from Transferring Assets and Memorandum of Points and Authorities in  
22 Support Thereof, together with the Certification of Kathleen Coughenour DeLaRosa in Support of  
23 Application for Temporary Restraining Order Without Notice, the Affidavits of Alan C. Walker,  
24 Glen Dishman, and Thomas A. Durkerley in support thereof, and the remaining exhibits submitted  
25 therewith, the Court having set a hearing regarding the allegations therein, and Defendants having  
26 failed to appear for that hearing, the Court finds:

- 1           1.       The Court has jurisdiction over Defendants and the subject matter of this litigation.
- 2           2.       Good cause exists to believe that Defendants have engaged in acts and practices that
- 3 violate A.R.S. §§ 44-1841, 44-1842, and 44-1991, and that violate the terms of a Temporary Order
- 4 to Cease and Desist and Notice of Opportunity for Hearing (“Temporary Order”) served on
- 5 Defendants on or about March 30, 2004.
- 6           3.       Good cause exists to believe that Defendants will continue to engage in the
- 7 aforesaid violations, including the continued sale of unregistered securities with resulting loss by
- 8 the investing public, unless restrained and enjoined by an order of this Court.
- 9           4.       Good cause exists to believe that Defendants used improper means to obtain
- 10 investor funds and assets.

11           IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Defendants, their officers, agents, servants,  
12 employees, and attorneys, and those persons in active concert or participation with them who  
13 receive actual notice of the order by personal service or otherwise, be and hereby are enjoined  
14 directly or indirectly from:

- 15           1.       Selling or offering for sale within or from this state any securities in violation of the
- 16 Arizona Securities Act, including A.R.S. §§ 44-1841 and 44-1842.
- 17           2.       In connection with a transaction or transactions within or from this state involving
- 18 an offer to sell or buy securities, or a sale or purchase of securities, violating A.R.S. § 44-1991 by:
- 19 (a) employing any device, scheme or artifice to defraud; (b) making any untrue statement of
- 20 material fact, or omitting to state any material fact necessary in order to make the statements made,
- 21 in the light of the circumstances under which they were made, not misleading; or (c) engaging in
- 22 any transaction, practice or course of business that operates or would operate as a fraud or deceit.
- 23           3.       Transferring, secreting, dissipating, altering, selling, pledging, assigning,
- 24 encumbering, expending, concealing, conveying, liquidating, or otherwise disposing of any assets,
- 25 funds or property owned by the Defendants.

26           IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that each Defendant shall forthwith give actual notice of this

1 Order to each of said Defendant's officers, directors, agents, debtors, lessees, servants, trustees,  
2 attorneys, spouses, employees, real estate agents, accountants, assigns, escrow officers, and bailees  
3 and to each person in active concert or participation with that Defendant.
