### **ACC Launches Site for User-friendly Access to Commission Dockets**

**PHOENIX, AZ** – In its ongoing effort to provide greater accessibility, the Arizona Corporation Commission (ACC) is launching an overhaul of its eDocket website, a site where the filings, schedules and decisions for all Commission proceedings are housed. The new site can be found at <http://edocket.azcc.gov>.

In response to public feedback, the ACC has made improvements to the eDocket application to improve the ease of its use. The new site is compatible with a variety of browsers, such as Internet Explorer 10, Firefox, Safari and Chrome, and has greatly improved search functionality. It works on multiple devices (PCs, tablets and phones), where the application layout changes based on the device you are using.

New interactive features include:

- Navigation is now much more user friendly and cleaner in display of information. There are four main selections up front in the application- Search, Calendar, Reports, and Frequently Asked Questions.
- Search has been consolidated down to just 3 search types: Docket, Document, and Event Detail. Quick Search is still available and now works for a Company Name search.
- The Calendar has been improved in navigation, display, readability, and use of color. The ability to filter out specific types of events, hearings, or open meetings has been added.
- All Frequently Asked Questions have been consolidated under distinct categories for easier viewing.
- RSS feed subscription is more visible from the main page.

The Commission hopes that the new website will be easy to navigate, enhance the Commission's services, and that it will make information the public needs more readily available. Other advancements the Commission has made in the last year to provide greater public interactivity are: public comment and public "Request to Speak" features, live video streaming from the Commission's Tucson hearing room (streaming video from the Phoenix offices had been previously available, and an overhaul of the Commission's website.
