IN THE MATTER OF THE APPLICATION OF ARIZONA PUBLIC SERVICE COMPANY FOR A HEARING TO DETERMINE THE FAIR VALUE OF THE UTILITY PROPERTY OF THE COMPANY FOR RATEMAKING PURPOSES, TO FIX A JUST AND REASONABLE RATE OF RETURN THEREON, TO APPROVE RATE SCHEDULES DESIGNED TO DEVELOP SUCH RETURN, AND FOR APPROVAL OF PURCHASED POWER CONTRACT.

PROCEDURAL ORDER

BY THE COMMISSION:

On June 27, 2003, the Arizona Public Service Company ("APS") filed with the Arizona Corporation Commission ("Commission") and application for a rate increase and for approval of purchased power contract.

On July 3, 2003, the Arizonans for Electric Choice and Competition ("AECC") filed an Application to Intervene.

On July 11, 2003, the Federal Executive Agencies ("FEA") filed a Motion to Intervene.

On July 22, 2003, the Kroger Company ("Kroger") and the Residential Utility Consumer Office ("RUCO") filed Applications to Intervene.

On July 23, 2003, the Arizona Utility Investors Association, Inc. ("AUIA") filed an Application to Intervene.

On July 25, 2003, the Utilities Division Staff ("Staff") of the Commission filed a letter stating that the application was found sufficient and classified the application as a Class A utility.

On July 28, 2003, Phelps Dodge Corporation and Phelps Dodge Mining Company (collectively "Phelps Dodge") filed Motions to Intervene.

No objections have been filed and accordingly, the applications to intervene filed by AECC, FEA, Kroger, RUCO, AUIA and Phelps Dodge should be granted.

1 IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that AECC, FEA, Kroger, RUCO, AUIA, and Phelps Dodge
2 are hereby granted intervention in the above-captioned matter.

3 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that a **Procedural Conference** shall be held to discuss the
4 procedural schedule for this matter on **August 13, 2003 at 2:00 p.m.**, at the Commission's offices,
5 1200 West Washington Street, Arizona 85007.

6 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Presiding Officer may rescind, alter, amend, or waive
7 any portion of this Procedural Order either by subsequent Procedural Order or by ruling at hearing.


