Pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-431.02, notice is hereby given to the members of the general public, the parties and the Arizona Power Plant and Transmission Line Siting Committee ("Committee") that the Committee will hold a meeting/hearing on the above application that is open to the public at the Holiday Inn at 777 N. Pinal Avenue, Casa Grande, Arizona 85122. Telephone number: (520) 426-3500. The hearing will begin on Wednesday, May 16, 2012, beginning at 9:30 a.m. The hearing will continue on Thursday, May 17, beginning at 9:00 a.m. However, if a tour is taken, it will begin at 8:00 a.m. on May 17. The hearing will continue on Friday, May 18, beginning at 9:00 a.m. The hearing will adjourn at approximately 5:00 p.m. on each day. Public comment may be taken during the hearing at times designated by the Chairman. Public comment also will be taken in a special evening session on May 16 beginning at 6:00 p.m. at the same location. Additional days for the hearing may be set, and the hearing may conclude earlier or later than anticipated, depending upon the number of parties that intervene, the amount of testimony presented, the amount of public comment, and the time needed for deliberations by the Committee. As a part of the public meeting/hearing, members of the Committee will discuss the potential value of a tour, and, at the discretion of the Chairman of the Committee, may tour the proposed transmission line route for the project on May 17 beginning at 8:00 a.m. At the meeting/hearing, the Committee may consider, discuss, deliberate and/or vote on the matters on the Agenda. Items on the Agenda may be taken in a different order than listed as conditions require.

- 10 designated stops. The Chairman of the Committee will make any
- 11 procedural decisions necessary concerning the stops at the different
- 12 points of interest on the tour;


