If a tour is taken, it will begin on September 17, 2019, at approximately 7:00 a.m. or an alternative date and time set by the Chairman of the Committee ("Chairman"). If necessary, the hearing will continue September 19, 2019, at 9:00 a.m. at the Aspen Room, 2223 East 7th Avenue C, Flagstaff, Arizona 86004.
